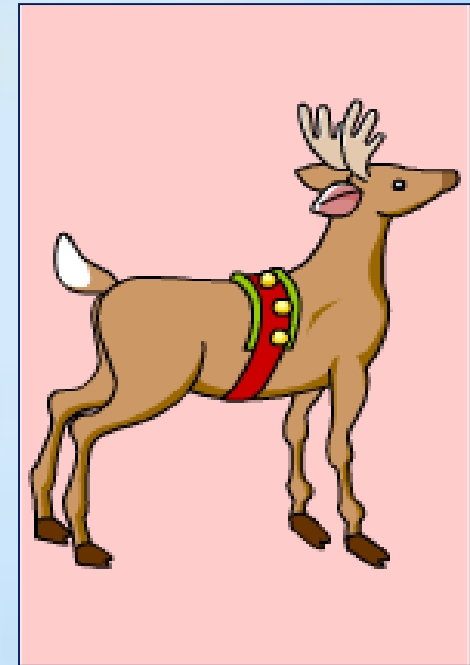
Point to the picture

He is based on a real person who lived in Myra in the 4th century AD. He brings presents for children on the night before Christmas Day.



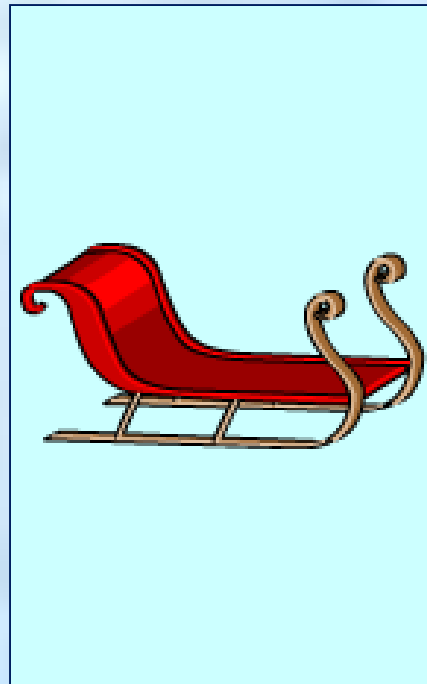
Point to the picture

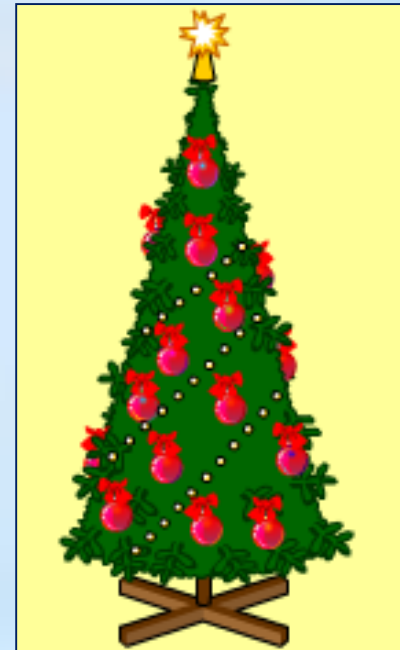
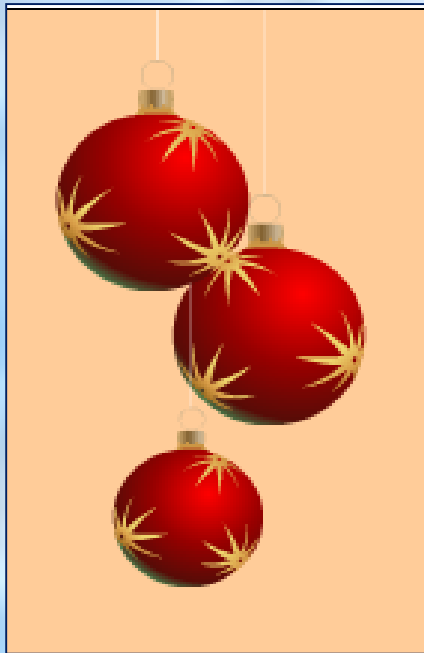
Point to the picture

This thing is pulled by reindeer and it can fly.



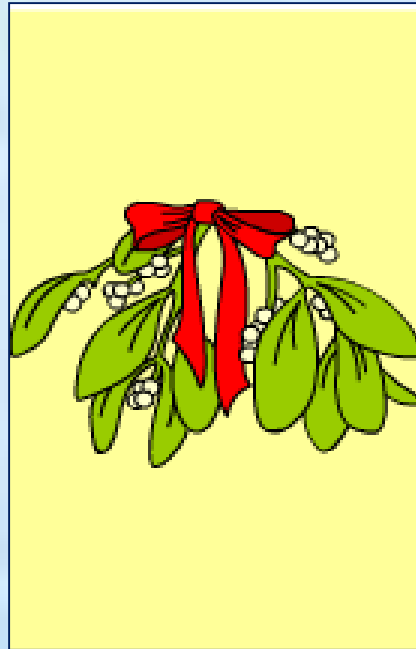
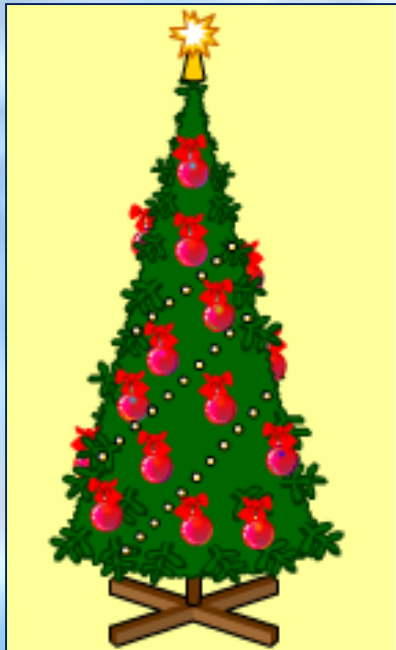
Point to the picture

This event is held in a church on Christmas Eve, lasts through part of night and many people attend it to meet Christmas Day.



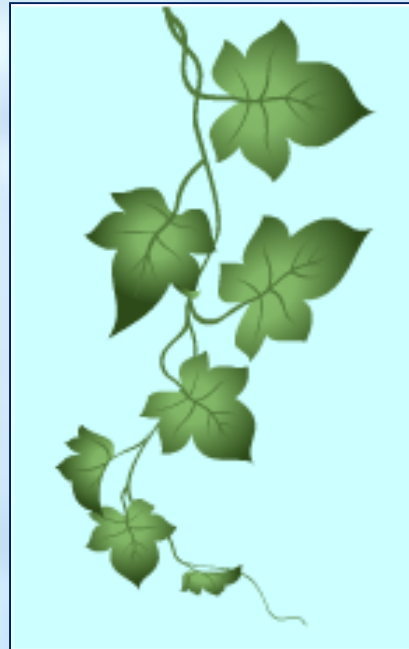
Point to the picture

This plant was sacred for Druids because it grows on oak and never touches the ground. if you stand under it you get a kiss.



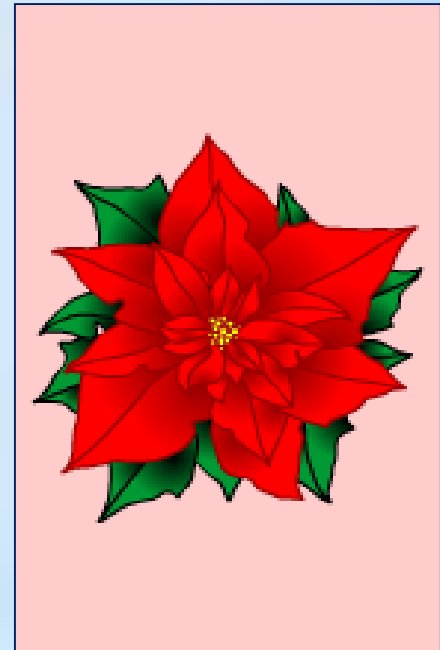
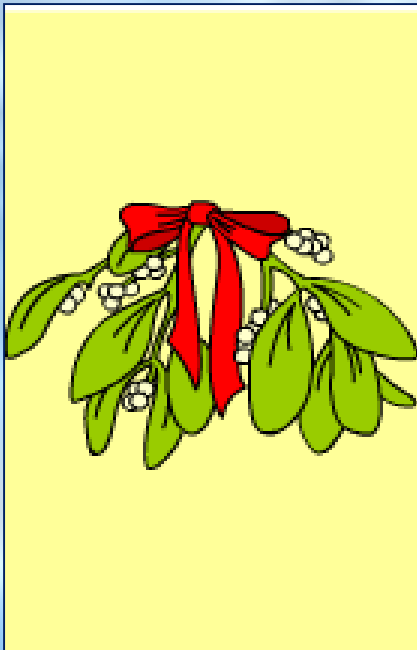
Point to the picture

It was first made and posted in 1843. It had a picture of a family celebrating together. Every family sends and receives them at Christmas.



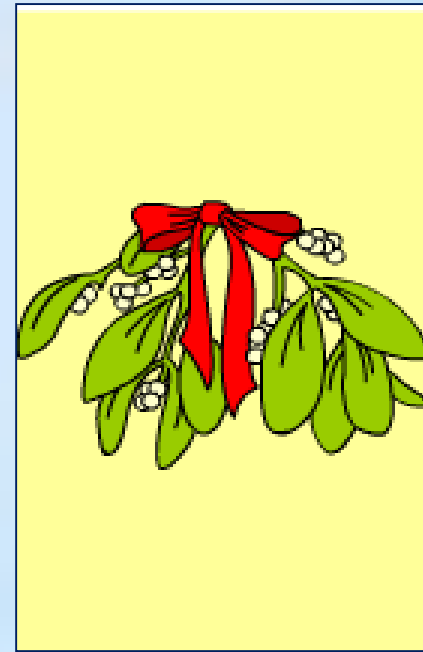
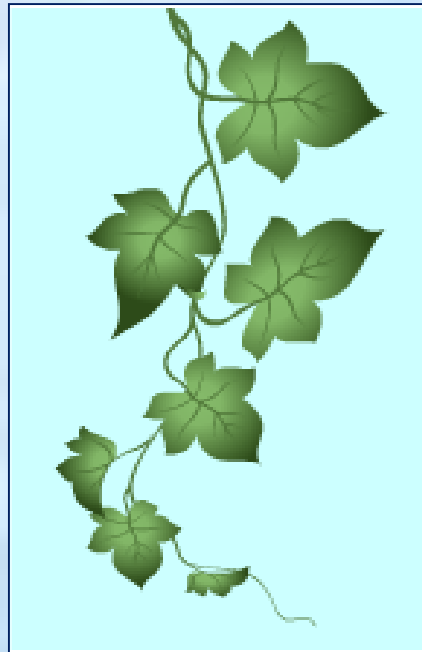
Point to the picture

This plant symbolizes eternal life. It is bad luck to bring it home at any other time except Christmas. The walls of many old houses are covered with this plant.



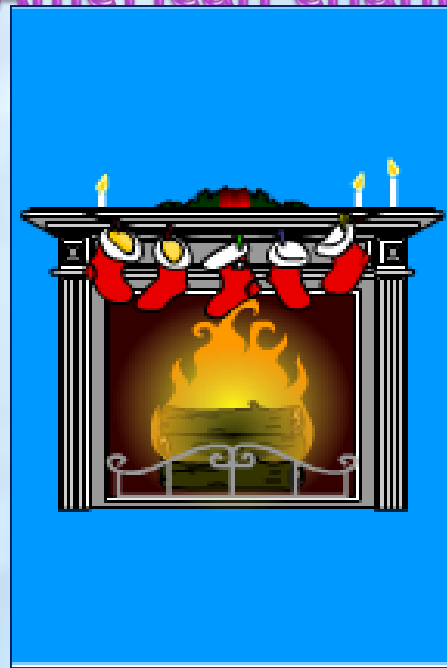
Point to the picture

This is a traditional Christmas dessert made from fruit, nuts, flour. It looks very dark and is cooked on steam many days before Christmas.



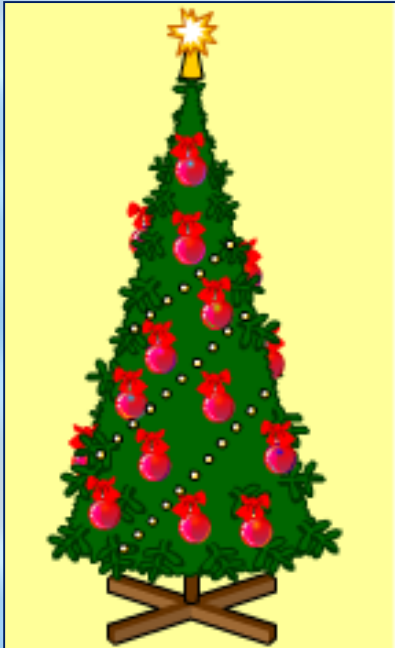
Point to the picture

It was burned by Celts in winter to celebrate the sun. Its burning is often shown on TV for several hours by many American channels.



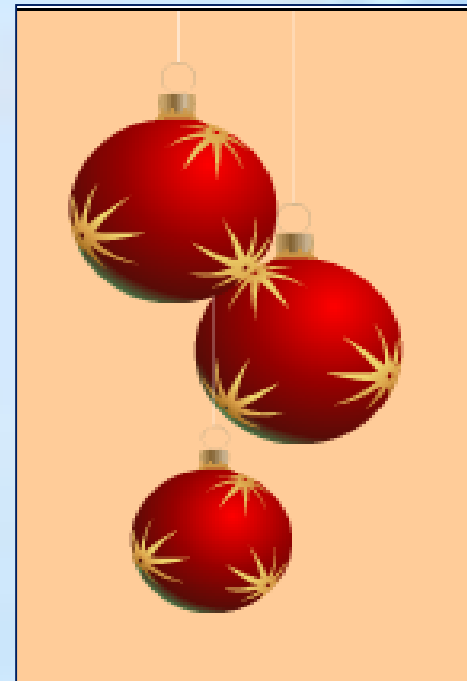
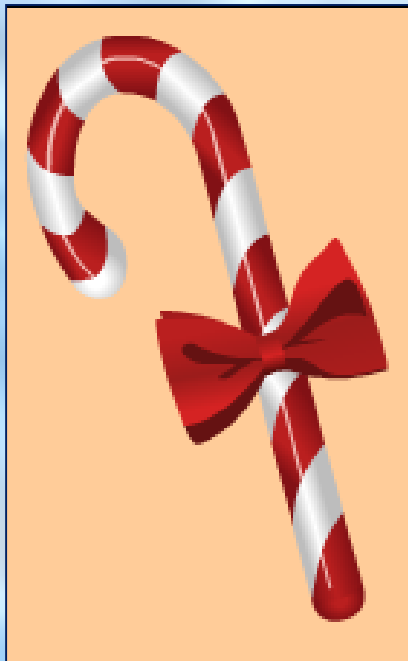
Point to the picture

This plant bears fruit in winter. Its berries are red and symbolize drops of blood. Its leaves are dark green and symbolize the crown of thorns.



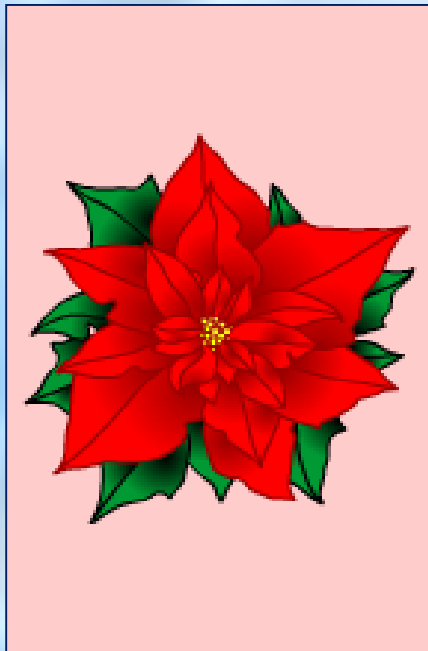
Point to the picture

This is a treat and a decoration made of sugar. In the 17th century they were straight. Now they look like a shepherd's crook.



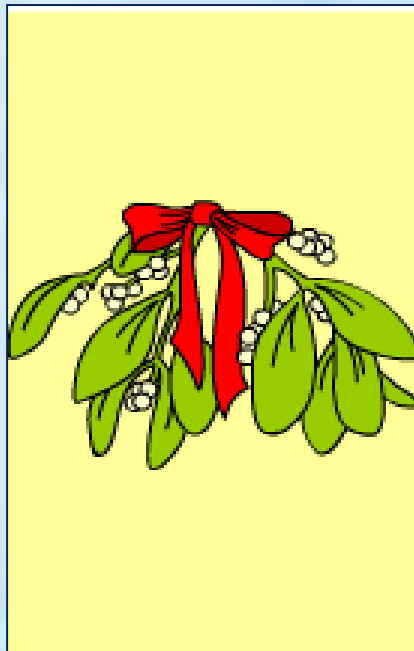
Point to the picture

Usually they are red and green and used as ornaments. They include bells, candles and lights. They must be taken down on January 5th.



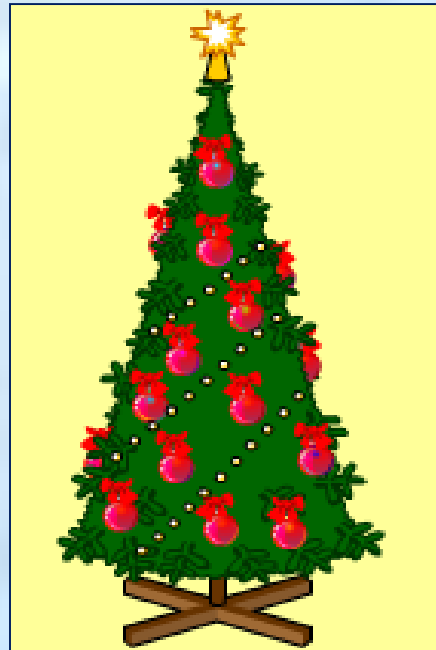
Point to the picture

This is made from evergreen plants and is hung on the doors of people's homes. In churches it has five candles in it.



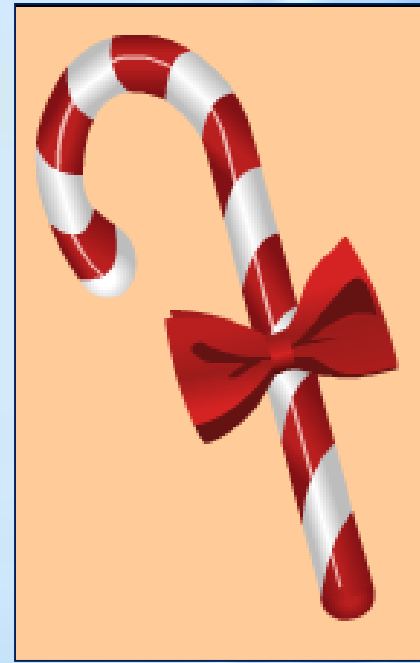
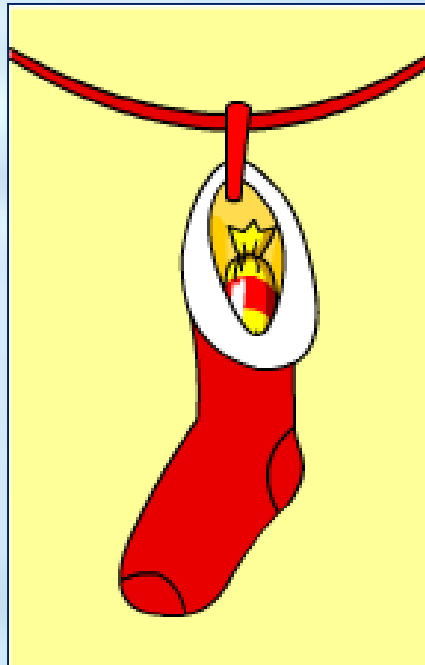
Point to the picture
